

The proceedings of the National Seminar conducted in the college is published in the form of Educational Research Journal. This year we have undertaken 4 minor Research Projects in Humanities and Social Science which is being supported by UGC grand-in-aid, which is implemented on 01.04.014

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

We have a library with 100 seating capacity and more than 12607 books and enriched with research materials, encyclopaedias, Dissertation Abstracts, International and other educational materials in soft and hard forms. Our computer lab. has 50 computers with internet connection and students make use of it every day. ICT enabled Classes are conducted. We have two smart class rooms. The faculty use new technologies, LCD and OHPs in curriculum transactional process. The department of Languages, Social Science, Science and Mathematics develop power point projects and various audio-visual materials. For Physical Education purposes we use the facilities offered by our cooperating school (Swimming pool and play ground etc.) which is situated in the same campus.

Networking with other educational institutions is an integral part of our college. Our trainees are sent to neighbouring schools for practice teaching for about 11/2 months a year. Seminars and workshops conducted to update the teachers of schools in Bihar. Extension service rendered to other colleges and universities by sending our staff as external examiners, selection committee members, resource persons and inspectors.

7.2 Provide the Action Taken Report (ATR) based on the plan of action decided upon at the beginning of the year

As per the plan of action decided during the meeting of IQAC in the beginning of year, the session 2013-14 of B.Ed. commenced on 1st July, 2013 and **M.Ed.** session began from 1st August, 2013.

As part of pre-practice teaching a seminar on Microteaching was held from 11-13 July 2014 which included the formulation of specific objectives, questioning techniques, introduction to Bloom's taxonomy of educational objectives, and audio visual aids to prepare the trainees well for practice teaching. The teachers took model lessons. Subsequently simulation classes and criticism classes in each of the method subjects were taken by the trainees. Workshop on Integral Pedagogy Paradigm was held from 16-17 August, 2013.

Practice teaching and internship were held from 19th September to 11th November, 2013.

Our academic and co-curricular activities are directed to make one intellectually, emotionally, spiritually and physically competent. We insist that every member of the college family works towards this objective. We also try to be in tune with the modern technologies in our efforts to train our students to be truly modern and fully human. We expect our graduating trainees to be well-motivated teachers who will be catalysts of social transformation. Our efforts have also been promotion of spiritual and moral values.

The **Proquest on-line** DISSERTATION ABSTRACTS INTERNATIONAL has been included in our library from 2013-2014 session. This helps our **M.Ed. students** to prepare their Dissertation more quickly and easily.

The college is fully conscious of the need for empowerment of women who have been and continue to be a deprived lot in the world. So as usual this year also we have conducted a talk on "Legal information on Women Empowerment" on the occasion of Women's Day.

We have also conducted a special talk on Earning while Learning which also helped the poor and needy students to earn something to meet the extra expenses of their studies. A seminar on anticorruption was organized by Hindustan Petroleum, Patna which was very helpful to be more aware with the present situation of our country and to guide their students to be more alert.

A National seminar on "**Quality Enhancement in Higher Education through IQAC**" was organized by IQAC of our college on 1st & 2nd February 2014. Total of 218 teachers including our **B.Ed.** and **M.Ed.** students and teachers participated from all over India.

This year the college completed 25 years in teacher education. On 1st December, 2013 the college celebrated its **Silver Jubilee Finale** in which our teacher trainees presented a prayer service and a variety of cultural programme. Out of the 99 students appeared in the university examination of B.Ed. 54 secured First class with Distinction 40 First Divisions and 5 pending, and out of the 34 appeared in the M.Ed. university examinations 33 secured First class with Distinction and 1 failed.

In conclusion the academic atmosphere of the institution has been of great advantage for the general well being of our students and this fact has contributed to their all round development as future teachers.

Taxonomy of Educational Objectives (B.S. Bloom)

1. KNOWLEDGE: It means that the student knows and recalls common terms, specific facts, methods and procedures, basic concepts and principles. Illustrative behavioural terms: Defines, describes, identifies, lists, matches, names, outlines, reproduces, selects, states.

2. COMPREHENSION: It means that the student understands facts and principles, interprets verbal material, interprets charts & graphs, translates verbal material to mathematical formulas, estimates future consequences implied in data, justifies method & procedure.

Illustrative behavioural terms: Converts, distinguishes, estimates, explains extends, generalises, gives examples, infers, paraphrases, predicts, rewrites, summarises.

3. APPLICATION : It means that the student applies concepts and new principles to new situations, applies laws and principles to practical situation, solves mathematical problems, demonstrates correct usage of a method or procedure.

Illustrative behavioural terms : Changes, computes, demonstrates, discovers, manipulates, modifies, predicts, prepares, produces, relates, shows, solves, uses.

4. ANALYSIS: It means that the student recognizes unstated assumptions, recognizes logical fallacies in reasoning, distinguishes between facts and inferences, evaluates the relevance of data, analyses the organizational structure of a work (Art, Music, Writing).

Illustrative behavioural terms: breaks down differentiates, discriminates, distinguishes, illustrates, infers, relates, separates.

5. SYNTHESIS : It means that the student writes a well organized theme, gives a well organized speech, writes a creative short story, or poem or music, proposes a plan for an experiment, integrates learning for solving a problem, formulates a new scheme for classifying objects or events or ideas.

Illustrative behavioural terms: Categorises, combines compiles, composes, creates designs explains, organizes, plans, relates, rearranges, reconstructs, reorganizes, revises, rewrites, summarises.

6. EVALUATION : It means that the student judges the logical consistency of written material, judges the adequacy with which conclusions are supported by data, judges the value of work by use of internal criteria, judges the value of a work by use of external standard of excellence.

Illustrative behavioural terms: Appraises, compares, concludes, contrasts, criticises, justifies, relates, summarises, supports, refute
