

#### 2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

By the initiative of IQAC a placement interview of our B.Ed. and M.Ed. students was organised. 32 schools from Bihar had come to recruit our teacher-trainees. 80% of our trainees are placed in different schools of Bihar. For the first time in the college history such a large number of schools came to recruit our students and they were quite satisfied by the performance of our trainees. Also we receive vacancy notices from over 30 primary and secondary schools and few colleges from outside the state. These notices were displayed on the notice board of the college to be used by the student-teachers. Also a National Seminar on "Early Childhood Care and Education" in collaboration with All India Association for Educational Research was organized by IQAC on 26th May, 2016 & all our teachers and more than 50 teachers from Bihar have participated and presented papers during the same.


2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

The teachers infused the real world experience into the instructions and used different ways to identify the creative abilities of students and encouraged them to bring out the aspects of creativity in all their subjects and reflect on different ways to develop creative ideas and gave freedom to explore. Teachers in-corporated audio-visual materials in teaching. Supplement textbooks with models, filmstrips, movies and pictorial material were used in microteaching. These methods not only developed their ability to listen, but also helped them understand the concepts better. This methods in turn the student-teachers will adapt in their teaching career.

2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes :

The IQAC assists in creating a learner-centric environment which benefits to quality education. As the learning can come from an enriched context such as visiting a heritage site or museum, this year we had arranged an educational tour to the Archaeological Excavations at Nalanda. We use data about a learner's previous and current learning to create a personalized path through educational content. Adaptive system of teaching recommend the best place to start new content and when to review old content. We provide various tools for monitoring one's progress. They build on longstanding learning practices, like textbook reading and add a layer of computer-guided support. To regulate the teaching and learning process we emerge to monitor the process of teaching and learning, following the quality assurance orientations and to reflect and share teaching practices that enhance the whole academic experience, both from students, teachers, and researchers' perspectives. The institution evaluates the achievement of the students through content test in method subjects, class tests in theory papers and two semester tests. Work experience is evaluated internally by the work experience teachers throughout the session.




5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

The IQAC along with faculty provided academic guidance through tutorials and mentoring. There is provision for personal counselling to those who have emotional problems. These services are provided according to the needs of the students. We have a vigorous placement cell. There was a placement interview on March 31, 2017 at our college. With the initiative of IQAC this year 32 schools from Bihar had come to recruit our B.Ed. & M.Ed. students for placement. 70% of our students have been placed from 2015-2017 B.Ed. & M.Ed. session. Also we received vacancy notices from over 30 primary and secondary schools and few colleges from outside the state. These notices were displayed on the notice board of the college to be used by the student-teachers. Their applications were forwarded by the principal of the college.

#### 5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression

The academic atmosphere of the institution has been of great advantage for the general well being of our students and this fact has contributed to their all round development as future teachers. This is reflected in the feedback we receive from our past students. The institution promotes general and transferable skills like learning to learn, communication skills, use of information technology, learning to work together as well as independently, use of learner-centred pedagogy and provision of inclusive education through cooperative learning, use of discussion method, use of group method, use of interaction, cultural activities, seminars, use of media, use of computers, websites, browsing etc. We monitor the overall performance of our students through class tests, semester tests and continuous evaluation throughout the session.



- 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

St. Xavier's College of Education has made every possible effort to enrich the existing curriculum by initiating a variety of experiential learning opportunities that would help to translate its mission statement and goals into reality. The threads of the vision and goals of the College are reflected in all thrust areas of College life. This not only provides academic flexibility but also helps students to learn the importance of human values and strive for excellence at the level of each one's potential. Confirmation and recognition is evidenced by the ease of placements and progression to further study, nationally and internationally.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Integral Pedagogy Paradigm (IPP) is followed, which emphasizes context, experience, action reflection, and evaluation, It emphasizes cooperative learning, interactive learning, group learning, meaningful verbal learning and use of advance organization approach as proposed by Ausubel. Tutorials will be essential part of the teaching methodology. The habit of self-learning is promoted through home assignments, library work and group work. For internship experience the student teachers are required to attend the mass prayer of the school, taking attendance of the students, preparing timetables for absentee teachers, preparing bulletin board, organising thanksgiving function, invigilating examinations, preparing school diary etc.

Students are continually tested and evaluated in the form of content tests in method subjects and theory subjects. There is provision for two semester tests and the scores of the first semester test are used for remedial teaching and academic guidance. The students will be given variety of choices to earn credit to pass the subject. Participation in tutorials, debates, quizzes, presentations, case-studies, projects, practical test and many more modern tools will also be used. Each method which is proposed has specific learning purpose. The level of interaction of the students in these activities will be used to assess them. This assessment will help the teachers to have comprehensive assessment of a student. Similarly, case study methods will enhance the real business problem understanding of the students. This assessment method is very useful in evaluating the skills of the students. The students will be benefitted by the fact that they will not be assessed on a single test. The performance of a student could be affected by variety of reasons; some of them are beyond their control. Using these modern methodologies of assessment those beyond the control factors could be taken care of.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

Our College regularly publishes the "Journal of Research in Education" a bi-annual with ISSN No. 2347-5676 every year. In June 2017 we have published the VOL. 5, No. 1 of the same. All our faculty members initiatively publish a Research Article in the journal. Other than this, a number of research articles were published in National & International journals by our faculty during the year. Special Action Research classes are held for our students every week. Almost all the teachers are engaged in research work. Four of our faculty members have completed their UGC minor research projects in 2016. Two more are working on the UGC minor research project .

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Our Library has more than 13810 books. Research materials, ProQuest CD's, encyclopaedias, Dissertation Abstracts International and other educational materials in soft and hard forms are available in the library. 524 new books were added this year. More than 55 computers with internet & WiFi connectivity and students make maximum use of it every day. For Physical Education purposes we use the facilities offered by our sister school (Swimming pool, play ground etc.) of the same campus.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management :

During the session our teachers have participated in the workshop "Self Transformation for Effective Teaching" Leadership Programme for Teachers" which organized by St. Xavier's College of Management & Technology in collaboration with our college. A National Seminar on "Early Childhood Care and Education" in collaboration with All India Association for Educational Research was organized by our college all our teachers have participated and presented papers in the same. A Guest Lecture by Supriya Ghosh (A Research Scholar from Patna University) on "Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse: Role & Responsibility of Teachers and School" was held. Seminar on Human Rights was sponsored by National Human Rights Commission, New Delhi, was organized. A seminar on Prevention of Tuberculosis and HIV/AIDS was held during the session Seminar on "Women Empowerment on the occasion of International Women's Day. A seminar on ProQuest (Dissertation Abstract) was held for M.Ed. students to help them prepare their Dissertation.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

A selection Committee is constituted by the Governing Body of the institution to select and appoint staff when need arises. Staff are recruited through advertisement followed by a demonstration class-cum-interview.

#### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The College is the study centre of IGNOU for B.Ed.& M.Ed. courses. It gets an opportunity to interact with the course material, IGNOU personnel and counsellors. Our B.Ed./M.Ed. students are sent to neighbouring schools for practice teaching/Internship for 20 weeks/ 1 month respectively during their two years' training here. Seminars and workshops were conducted to update the teachers of schools in Bihar. Extension service rendered to other colleges and universities by sending our staff as external examiners, selection committee members, resource persons, inspectors and judges for competitions etc. We have established linkage with AIACHE, IGNOU, JHEASA, Xavier Board, SCERT, NCERT, and some prominent universities and educational institutions of our country.

#### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

As per the NCTE norms, candidates with at least 50% of marks in graduation can apply for B.Ed. and 55% of marks in B.Ed. are eligible to apply for M.Ed. course. The process of admission starts in March with an advertisement in the newspaper for registration followed by written test, interview, group discussion and selection of candidates in June. Admissions are closed latest by the beginning of July.



#### Discipline Maintenance at St. Xavier's College of Education, Patna

#### Discipline is the refining fire by which talent becomes ability. Roy L. Smith

All the students who are admitted to St. Xavier's college of Education are members of the college community and are expected to behave responsibly, to respect people and property and to abide by the rules and regulations of the college. The conduct of students should not obstruct with the proper functioning of the college.

Any misbehaviour causing disturbance to the smooth functioning of the college will be subject to disciplinary action.

Violation of discipline includes:

- Irregularity, disobedience, late coming and loitering about in the college
- Causing disruption, in any manner, of the academic functioning of the college
- Physical assault or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching
  - and non-teaching staff and against any student of the college.
- Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women.
- Ragging in any form is prohibited in Educational Institutions under Supreme Court of India Orders.
- Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner.
- Willful destruction of institutional property.
- Default in the payment of fees, fine etc.
- Not wearing college uniform and not carrying the Identity Cards in the College.
- Use of mobile phones in the library, class rooms and examination hall
- Use of unfair means during examinations
- Any other act of indiscipline which is unbecoming of a student.

All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Principal

Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Principal may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid, order or direct:

- o that any student or students be expelled; or
- o be rusticated for a stated period; or
- o be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
- be debarred from taking University or College Examinations for one or more years; or
- That the result of the student or students concerned, in the Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared, be cancelled.
