2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

Prior to the first period of classes we have meditation & Yoga for the students & staff. A number of activities are undertaken to supplement theory classes. Students are made to participate in workshops, tutorials, debates, quiz, presentation of classes, case-studies, project work and assignment, Psychology practical tests, Bio-Socio Analysis, viva-voce. Emphasis is placed on the development of teaching and communication skills in students. We encourage our students to participate in all the co-curricular activities which make them self-confident and bring out their hidden talents and thus promote students' interaction with each other. Each method had a specific learning purpose as these are very useful for evaluating the skills of students. We provided scholarships and interest free loan to the marginalized and the poor to complete their course successfully at our college. The average and even some below average students have done well within their limits. By the time they leave our college, we see noticeable improvement in them.

2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes :

Since the college was granted autonomy this year, the entire syllabus was re-shuffled and Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced and the whole B.Ed. course was changed into four semesters. M.Ed. course was already in semester system and it had no change. In the beginning of the session, the teachers were asked to make the course design in a register and keep it for their perusal after getting it approved by the Principal. The IQAC has taken initiatives to remove deficiencies and enhance quality in education by conducting seminars on value education, environmental education, health education, Human Rights, Awareness Programmes on different diseases and many other day to day activities. In every semester we conducted a mid-sem exam. prior to semester-end exams and the results of the same was given to the students to improve their performance.

### 5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

We frame our academic calendar in advance which includes all activities of the two years programmes of B.Ed. & M.Ed. Once in a month mentoring is conducted in small groups of 9-10 students by our teachers. Regular meetings of different committees like sexual harassment, antiragging and students grievance cell is conducted. Seminar on Gender sensitization is conducted every year on the occasion of International Women's Day. The economically weak students are supported with college Scholarship & interest free loan. This year itself, the college has granted scholarships for 20 financially weak students, amounting a total of Rs. 4,85,000/-.

We conducted content and class tests in certain breaks and the students' performance is measured accordingly. In every semester we conducted a mid-sem exam. prior to semesterend exams and the results of the same was given to the students to improve their performance. Mentoring is conducted every month.

- 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

This year, the entire syllabus was reshuffled and necessary changes were made as per UGC regulations for Autonomous colleges. Our institution makes an extremely important contribution to the outstanding standards achieved by our students.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The students required to study different areas and disciplines of Education mainly Learning and Teaching, Contemporary India and Education, Creating an Inclusive School, Gender, School & Society, Knowledge & Curriculum etc. Relationship between and among different subjects are emphasized. Integral Pedagogy is followed all through which emphasizes context, Action, Reflection and Evaluation. Video recording of teaching and re-viewing of the same for improvement. Visits are made to historical sites. Seminars conducted by experts on educational topics. The habit of self-learning is promoted through home assignments, library work and group work. Our college provided opportunity for all round development of trainees' personality through cultural programmes, seminars, sports and games, and competitions like quiz, essay, debate, Kavi Ghoshti. Functional and Performing Arts are also part of our curriculum.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examination and evaluation are done through content tests in method subjects and theory subjects. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced after autonomy and the whole B.Ed. syllabus was changed into four semester. We follow CCE and in every semester we conducted a mid-sem exam. and semester-end exam and the results of the same was given to the students to improve their performance. For Work Experience we have included Gardening & Craft and it is evaluated internally by experienced teachers. At the end of the session the students need to submit a Report on all the activities of the entire session which is internally evaluated by their mentors.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

We are committed to promoting quality education and are working for academic excellence by conducting research training and innovative activities. The students prepared a project on Action Research which is included in our syllabus. Research and documentation is one of the objectives of our institution. Six of our faculty members have completed their Minor Research Projects funded by UGC. Our college regularly publishes a bi-annual: "Journal of Research in Education" in which our faculty, M.Ed. & Ph.D. scholars publish their Research articles. Linkages made with other institutions of Patna in relation to research work.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management:

Six Minor Research Projects have been completed since 2014. As a regular feature seminar on Research and Dissertation, was conducted this year, too, for all our B.Ed. & M.Ed. students. Five of our faculty members are pursuing their Ph.D. Our college also has collaborated with Patna Women's College, Patna for a NAAC sponsored National Seminar on "Excellence in Higher Education: Emerging Concerns and the Road Ahead". Our M.Ed. students have organized a seminar on "Indian Educational Philosophy and its Relevance in 21<sup>st</sup> Century." Our college regularly publishes a bi-annual: "Journal of Research in Education" in which our faculty, M.Ed. & Ph.D. scholars publish their Research articles. A seminar on Human Rights was conducted by PUCL, Patna for our B.Ed. & M.Ed. students on 16 April, 2019. Orientation course is conducted for teachers in the beginning of the session.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The Staff Selection Committee and Governing Body of the institution select and appoint staff when need arises. Staff are recruited through advertisement in prominent news papers followed by a demonstration class-cum-interview.

#### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The College is the study centre of IGNOU. Our B.Ed. students are sent to neighbouring schools for practice teaching/Internship for 1 month in the first semester, 2 months in the third semester and 2 months in the fourth semester. M.Ed. students complete their 32 hours internship in our B.Ed. department during their second semester and in third semester they are sent to different schools for one month internship. Seminars and workshops were conducted to update the teachers of schools in Bihar. Extension services rendered to other colleges and universities by sending our staff as external examiners, selection committee members, resource persons, inspectors and judges for competitions etc. We also conduct workshops/seminars for teachers in collaboration with other colleges of Bihar.

#### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

From the session 2018-20, Bihar government has introduced Combined Entrance Test conducted by Nalanda Open University for B.Ed. After the CET students are allotted different B.Ed. colleges of Bihar. As per the allotment list of NOU we admit students for B.Ed. course. For M.Ed. course Aryabhatta Knowledge University conducts its CET and then students who are desirous to get admitted to our college send an application and the counselling followed. Selected students are admitted to our college by the end of June and the classes starts on the first week of July.

Our college campus is eco-friendly with variety of trees and plants. This year also we have planted a number of trees in our campus. We have included gardening as part of our curriculum and students are taught Budding Grafting and thus making new saplings to plant. Environment Education classes are also included in our curriculum. Students are instructed to use Eco friendly materials for their daily use. A two day seminar on Environment Education for Sustainability is conducted every year at Taru Mitra Ashram, Patna an NGO for Bio-reserve. Seed bombs are prepared to place on the road and thus in rainy season the seeds are opened up and take roots. Rain water harvesting by making pits in the ground and terrace water is diverted to the same pits. 2 KV roof top Solar Power System is installed at the college campus.

After getting Autonomy, the entire syllabus of B.Ed. course was re-shuffled and necessary changes were made. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced and the whole B.Ed. course was changed into four semesters. All the other formalities were completed as per UGC regulations for Autonomous colleges.

Games and Sports activities were held on 17.02.2019 and all the trainees took active part in them.

#### **Educational Tour:**

An Educational Tour was arranged for M.Ed. & B.Ed. 2018-20 to Rajgir, & Nalanda on 27/02/2019. Students have collected historical data of both places for their report writing.

#### Placement services provided to students:

#### **Examination & Results**

The 2<sup>nd</sup> year examination for B.Ed. 2016-2018 was held from 9th October to 3rd November 2018 and the results were announced on 20/12/2018 out of 100 students appeared 89 passed with Distinction and 11 First Division. The IV Semester examination for M.Ed. 2016-2018 was held from 23/07/2018 to 03/08/2018 and results were announced on 30/08/2018. Out of 25 appeared 23 secured distinction and 2 First Divisions.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> year examination for B.Ed. 2017-2019 was held from 16<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> February 2019 and the results were announced on 19/03/2019. Out of 98 students appeared 82 passed with Distinction and 16 First Division. ## Taxonomy of Educational Objectives (B.S. Bloom)

- 1. KNOWLEDGE: It means that the student knows and recalls common terms, specific facts, methods and procedures, basic concepts and principles. Illustrative behavioural terms: Defines, describes, identifies, lists, matches, names, outlines, reproduces, selects, states.
- 2. COMPREHENSION: It means that the student understands facts and principles, interprets verbal material, interprets charts & graphs, translates verbal material to mathematical formulas, estimates future consequences implied in data, justifies method & procedure.

Illustrative behavioural terms: Converts, distinguishes, estimates, explains extends, generalises, gives examples, infers, paraphrases, predicts, rewrites, summarises.

**3. APPLICATION**: It means that the student applies concepts and new principles to new situations, applies laws and principles to practical situation, solves mathematical problems, demonstrates correct usage of a method or procedure.

Illustrative behavioural terms: Changes, computes, demonstrates, discovers, manipulates, modifies, predicts, prepares, produces, relates, shows, solves, uses.

**4. ANALYSIS**: It means that the student recognizes unstated assumptions, recognizes logical fallacies in reasoning, distinguishes between facts and inferences, evaluates the relevance of data, analyses the organizational structure of a work (Art, Music, Writing).

Illustrative behavioural terms: breaks down differentiates, discriminates, distinguishes, illustrates, infers, relates, separates.

**5. SYNTHESIS**: It means that the student writes a well organized theme, gives a well organized speech, writes a creative short story, or poem or music, proposes a plan for an experiment, integrates learning for solving a problem, formulates a new scheme for classifying objects or events or ideas.

Illustrative behavioural terms: Categorises, combines compiles, composes, creates designs explains, organizes, plans, relates, rearranges, reconstructs, reorganizes, revises, rewrites, summarises.

**6. EVALUATION**: It means that the student judges the logical consistency of written material, judges the adequacy with which conclusions are supported by data, judges the value of work by use of internal criteria, judges the value of a work by use of external standard of excellence.

Illustrative behavioural terms: Appraises, compares, concludes, contrasts, criticises, justifies, relates, summarises, supports, refute

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
