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INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

The event was planned for the whole week from 7th March to 14th March. On 7th we had the Collage Making Competition on the theme 'Gender Equality'. On 13th events like Inter House Role Play, Video Presentation, and Group Discussion on the theme 'Construction of gender in textbooks' was organized. 14th of March was supposed to have a talk on the theme "I am Generation Equality: Realizing Women's Rights" by Dr. Runoo Ravi, an Assistant Professor from MagadhUniversity. However, the scheduled talk could not take place due to unexpected government order of closing down of educational institutions as a precautionary measure against COVID-19.



ACADEMIC CHALLENGES AND ROLE OF TEACHERS DURING LOCKDOWN

The Government of India declared a nationwide lockdown on 18th March 2020, restricting the movement of the entire population of India as a preventive measure against the COVID-19 pandemic in India. The COVID-19 has become a global issue, and all the various social, political, economic and educational sectors have come to a standstill, as the mass gathering is highly prohibited so as to reduce disease transmission. Social distancing has become the norm for the new normal. However, the key to finding a solution to this pandemic situation is not through social distancing but rather through distance socializing. Therefore, most of the sectors have started 'work from home' policy.

Closure of the educational sector has created an unprecedented situation for its stakeholders. Instead of facing this situation with 'restriction and resolve' epithet, we teachers taking on community leadership roles could help students create peaceful and stable thought, adhere to particular strategies for taking care of themselves, as well as how to handle stressful scenarios, and above all to progress academically as well. So in a bid to update the teachers and create a structured learning environment at home with the help of technology, St. Xavier's College of Education (Autonomous) Patna, has organised a two day webinar on 21st and 22nd of April, 2020, on the theme "**Academic Challenges and Role of Teachers during Lockdown**".

The webinar coordinators incessantly worked for making it a success. For the different sessions, different resource experts were invited. The first day comprised of four sessions. The first session started at 11:00 A.M. with an inaugural speech by the Principal, Rev. Father Thomas Varghese SJ.

During this COVID-19 crisis, synchronous & asynchronous online classes have become the key to making education accessible to the students around the globe. Some educational institutions have asked teachers to prepare online material, but most teachers do not have the experience of preparing e-material. The teachers are facing many challenges regarding the type of digital platforms and e materials. So the subtheme for the 2nd session was "Judicious Use of Technology & ICT during Lockdown". This session was presented by Dr. Geeta S.Shetty, Associate Professor St. Xavier's Institute of Education, Mumbai.

The subtheme for the 3rd session was "Academic Challenges during Lockdown". This session was taken by Dr. Sanjay Sharma, Faculty School of Educational Studies, Dr. Hari Singh Gour Central University. Sagar.

The subtheme of the last session was "Teacher as a Motivator & Mentor" and the resource person for this session was Dr Ajay Kumar Choubey, Principal, Directorate of School of Education, Govt of Delhi. Thus fruitfully ended the first day of the webinar.

The 2nd day of the webinar started with the subtheme, discussing the role of teachers as a socializing agent and the topic was, "Social Media and Teacher as a Socializing Agent". The resource person for this session was Dr. Jaiswal, an Asst. Professor in Dr. Harisingh Gour University at Sagar, Madhya Pradesh.

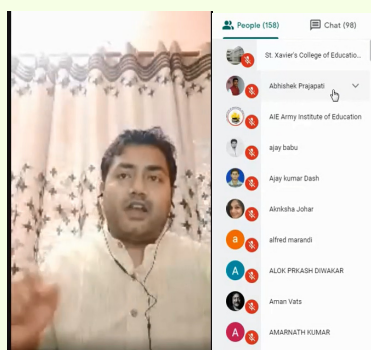
