teacher educators we have to learn to use ICT and also be ready to adapt it in our training system. It is the duty of every teacher training institution to provide an atmosphere where the future teachers are able to acquaint themselves with the technologies. Most of the schools today are adopting the latest methods of learning, yet we have a long way to go.

Chief Guest, **Prof. Janak Pandey** in his enlightening address said that training part is very important and therefore labs are to be provided where a trainee gets his firsthand experience. Teacher's role is very important. No ICT can replace it. ICT is supplementary and complementary to teaching learning process. He suggested that each institution should have seminar rooms with ICT gadgets.

Prof. C.B. Sharma said that technology was not in its infancy stage. Technology can do so many things that a human mind can't think of and that is a miracle. Knowing computer is not important but bringing it to use in daily life is more important. He strongly advised the student-teachers saying that the future is in their hands. The 21st century Hero is a teacher who will make the society vibrant and effective.


Prof. R.P. Singh, in his address, said that teachers are precious and nothing in this world can be placed above the teacher. Teacher is a unique person. ICT can bring changes bridging the gap between C grade knowledge and the A

grade knowledge.

Day two of the seminar began with a meaningful prayer service. Dr. Upasana Singh, HOD, Department of Education, PWC, Patna was the main speaker of the day. She said that quality enhancement is to make the teachers committed and fully equipped. Teacher is the facilitator of children's knowledge. Certainly ICT consumes much time. To have good approach towards ICT we should have mastery in the content. Teacher is the centre of the learning process. Teacher's professional development is a process, not an event. ICT helps the teacher for bringing variety.

54 delegates presented their papers on ICT in different groups. In the valedictory function Fr. Francis Parmer S.J., Principal, St. Xavier's College, Patna, was the chief guest. In his speech he said, "Every teacher should have a deep sense to learn the changes in technology and urge to apply his knowledge in the classroom situation taking care of the children's need. He said, "Information is to share and communication is to impart".

Prof. S.N. Sharma presented the concluding remarks based on the topic and the lectures delivered by the different speakers during the two days' seminar. Vote of thanks was proposed by Sushil Kumar Singh and a recap of the two days in video was presented by Deep Kumar. With the National Anthem the seminar concluded.









Learned speakers (i) Prof. H.K. Senapati, (ii) Prof. C.B. Sharma, (iii) Dr. Upasana Singh.

SEMINAR ON HUMAN RIGHTS





A UGC sponsored seminar on HUMAN RIGHTS was organized in our College for the M.Ed. and B.Ed. trainees on 3rd February. The seminar opened with the screening of the song "Lahoo ka rang kaya hai, lahoo ka jath kaya hai" edited by Deep Kumar. In his welcome address the college, Principal, Prof. Fr. Thomas Perumalil S.J., welcomed the guest speakers Fr. Philip Manthara S.J., President, PUCL, Bihar, Dr. Daisy Narayan, President State Child Rights Board, Bihar and Mr. Jitendra Choubey member of PUCL, Bihar. The Principal said in his address "Seminar on Human Rights is one of the yearly features of the college and it is very important to make you future teachers aware of human rights and you have to inculcate the same knowledge in your students when you play the role of a teacher".

Fr. Philip Manthara S.J. appreciated the song presented on human rights and in his speech he said, "As humans we have rights, and as nobody gives us these rights, no one has the right to take them away from us." Teachers have a great role to play to bring awareness among students. Fr. Philip presented examples saying that in the name of development many Musahar community members have lost their natural habitation and nobody is ready to take the responsibility of

providing them shelter and they are forced to spend their winter nights under the open sky. He also gave an example of the new park in front of the D.M. residence in city which years back was used by all sections of children but now that is only for those who can pay the entrance fee and a large number of children from poorer community are deprived of the right to use the park. Mr. Jitendra Choubey gave examples based on legal matters to show how the innocent people were trapped without any grave reason and put behind bars. One example was Dr. Binayak Sen, the social activist. The next spokesperson was Dr. Vinay Kanth, who shared his experiences and spoke on the importance of education for building a better society.

Dr. Daisy Narayan, President, State Child Rights Board, Bihar, spoke on child rights and women harassment and violence. She said every child has a right to get free and compulsory education till the age of 14 and nobody can deprive them of this right which is also in our Constitution.

Future teachers were called to join PUCL and help to raise the voice supporting human rights and checking violation of human rights. Our College faculty members also took part in the seminar.

Quiz Competition

A quiz contest was organized for the student-teachers (B.Ed) of the present batch on January 27, 2012. This was to update the students with the current affairs and also to give them training on how to conduct GK competition in schools. The areas covered were History, Geography, Current Affairs, Science, Sports, Literature, Culture, Entertainment, IT and information about the College. There were questions for the audience also who took active part and answered many questions. Teams from all the four houses took part in the Quiz.
